Tinto blends beloved Old Worlds reds (or Tintos in Spanish), including Tempranillo and Grenache which are popular in Spain. Grown in the warmer regions of San Luis Obispo County, the hot days allows this varieties to fully ripen, while the Ocean influence and higher elevations of the hillsides bring cool nighttime temperatures that maintain high acidity in the grapes.

This cool climate Syrah always has the benefit of ripening slowly. It brings an elegance with mesmerizing aromatics, smooth and well-structured tannins, and bright acidity to this wine. While the Tempranillo brings big flavors of dried fruit and spice, the Grenache imparts rich flavors including a beautiful red fruit profile. The oak aging adds vanilla and cedar notes.

The 2017 vintage in San Luis Obispo County was the first following years of drought. The winter rains nourished the soils allowing the vines to produce high-quality grapes despite a hot temperatures near Harvest.

We have barrel and bottle aged this wine for a significant period of time to allow it to integrate and soften. Upon opening, our friends and family will experience a well-structured, elegant wine with an intriguing spectrum of flavors and a memorable finish.
